Execution of building works.

The European Central Bank (ECB) is constructing its new premises on the site of the former wholesale market hall in Frankfurt-on-Main. The design by the Viennese architectural office Coop Himmelb(l)au for the new ECB premises (NEP) comprises 3 main elements: the 46-storey double tower, with its twisted shape, the former market hall with the new structures to be built inside it and finally the so-called entrance building which links the market hall to the high-rise and provides a clear main entrance from the north. The towers are joined over their entire height by a glazed atrium. A steel and glass building and the so-called 'loop' link this atrium directly to the Großmarkthalle on several levels. This ensemble will accommodate the majority of the functions and comprises the core of the new ECB premises. Around 2 300 office workplaces will be provided as well as a conference centre and the gross floor area (GFA) will total around 185 000 m<sup>2</sup>.

The construction works are tendered in packages and lots. The first packages (structural works, façade, building services (first part)) were tendered in 2009.

Further works will be tendered out in 2010/2011. It will include the following works:

- interior fit-out (including, for example, metal works, dry lining, ceilings, pantries, doors, flexible walls, carpeting, and paint works),
- technical building equipment (media technology, kitchen equipment, furniture and innovative equipment, including, for example, security systems and active network components),
- external landscaping works.

These tender packages will be further subdivided in order to foster competition and find specialised companies for each trade; the interior fit-out works will be tendered in 5 different tender packages.
